1 WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Yolo,
2 State of California, at a regular meeting of said Board held on
3 the 21st day of February, 1939, considered the report filed with
4 said Board in accordance with the provisions of the District In-
5 vestigation Act of 1933 upon the proposed Yolo County Fire Pro-
6 tection District in Yolo County; and

7 WHEREAS, said Board of Supervisors by resolution duly
8 passed and adopted by said Board, at said meeting, found and
9 determined that there were no legal objections to the formation
10 of said proposed fire protection district and decided to establish
11 a county fire protection district in Yolo County to be known as
12 "Yolo County Fire Protection District in Yolo County" to consist
13 of the following unincorporated territory within the County of
14 Yolo embraced within the boundaries described as follows, to-wit:

15 Beginning at the corner common to Sections 16, 17,
16 20 and 21, T. 10 N. R. 2 E., M. D. B. & M; thence Northerly
17 along the Section line between Sections 16 & 17 to the
18 center line of Cache Creek; thence Easterly and North-
19 easterly down and along the center line of Cache Creek
20 to its intersection with the center line of the Southern
21 Pacific Railroad; thence Northeasterly up and along the
22 center line of the Southern Pacific Railroad Property to
23 its intersection with the Section line between Sections
24 3 & 4 of above mentioned Township and Range; thence
25 Northerly $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles, more or less, along the last mentioned
26 Section line and along the Section line between Sections
27 33 & 34, and 27 & 28, T. 11 N.R. 2 E. to the corner common
28 to Sections 21, 22, 27 and 28, T. 11 N.R. 2 E; thence
29 Westerly $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the quarter-corner common to Sections
30 20 and 29, T. 11 N.R. 2 E; thence Northerly one mile to
31 the quarter-corner common to Sections 17 and 20, T. 11
32 N.R. 2 E; thence Westerly $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the Northeast corner
of Section 24, T. 11 N.R. 1 E; thence Southerly one-half
mile to the quarter-corner common to Section 19, T. 11
N.R. 2 E. and Section 24, T. 11 N.R. 1 E; thence Westerly
one mile to the quarter-corner common to Sections 23 and
24, T. 11 N.R. 1 E; thence Southerly one-half mile to the
Southeast corner of Section 23, T. 11 N.R. 1 E; thence
Westerly one mile to the Southeast corner of Section 22,
T. 11 N.R. 1 E; thence Southerly one-half mile to the
quarter-corner common to Sections 26 and 27, T. 11 N.R.
1 E; thence Westerly one mile to the quarter-corner
common to Sections 27 and 28, T. 11 N.R. 1 E; thence
Southerly one-half mile to the Southeast corner of Section
28, T. 11 N.R. 1 E; thence Westerly one and one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}$)
miles to the quarter-corner common to Sections 29 and 32,
T. 11 N.R. 1 E; thence Southerly one-half mile to the
center of Section 32, T. 11 N.R. 1 E; thence Westerly

1 one-half mile to the quarter-corner common to Sections
2 31 and 32, T. 11 N.R. 1 E; thence Southerly one-half mile
3 to the Southeast corner of Section 31, T. 11 N.R. 1 E;
4 thence Westerly one mile to the Southwest corner of
5 Section 31, T. 11 N.R. 1 E; thence Southerly about 2½
6 miles to the point of intersection of the Section line
7 between Section 13, T. 10 N.R. 1 W. and Section 18, T.
8 10 N.R. 1 E. with the Grant line along the Northerly
9 side of Rancho Guesisosi; thence Southeasterly about 3
10 miles along said Grant line to the Northeasterly corner
11 thereof; thence Southerly along the Easterly line of said
12 Grant to the center line of Cache Creek; thence North-
13 easterly down and along the Southerly center line of Cache
14 Creek to its point of intersection with the Section line
15 between Sections 12 and 13, T. 10 N.R. 1 E; thence Easterly
16 about one-half mile to the corner common to said Sections
17 12 and 13 and Sections 7 and 18, T. 10 N.R. 2 E; thence
18 Southerly one mile, more or less, to the Southwest corner
19 of Section 18; thence Easterly 2 miles to the point of
20 beginning; and

21 WHEREAS, the said Board of Supervisors of the County of
22 Yolo sitting in regular meeting on said 21st day of February, 1939,
23 passed and adopted a resolution calling a special election to be
24 held in said county fire protection district on the 28th day of
25 March, 1939, for the purpose of determining by the vote of the
26 qualified electors of said district the question as to whether
27 said Yolo County Fire Protection District shall be established
28 and for the purpose of submitting to the electors at said election
29 the proposition of electing E. L. Baird, Albert W. Schneegas and
30 George B. Weiss as directors of such county fire protection
31 district; and

32 WHEREAS, said resolution calling said election contained
and provided for all of the things required by law concerning the
holding of said election; and

WHEREAS, the notice of said election prescribed in said
resolution was duly published and posted in the manner and for the
length of time required by law and as directed by said Board of
Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, said election was duly and regularly held in
said proposed Yolo County Fire Protection District, as directed
by said Board of Supervisors, on the 28th day of March, 1939; and

1 WHEREAS, the returns of said election have been filed
2 with said Board of Supervisors in the manner and form required by
3 law; and

4 WHEREAS, said Board of Supervisors of the County of Yolo
5 has duly canvassed the said election returns of said election;

6 IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED AND ORDERED by the Board of
7 Supervisors of the County of Yolo, State of California:

8 1. That at the special election held in the hereinabove
9 described Yolo County Fire Protection District in the County of
10 Yolo there was submitted to the duly qualified electors of said
11 district the propositions: "Shall the Yolo County Fire Protection
12 District be established", and "Directors - Vote for three - E. L.
13 Baird, Albert W. Schneegas and George B. Weiss", and opposite and
14 to the right of said proposals on the ballots voted at said
15 election were printed the words "Yes" and "No" together with
16 voting squares;

17 2. That there were forty-nine (49) votes cast at said
18 election; that forty-six (46) votes were cast in favor of the
19 proposal to form said Yolo County Fire Protection District and
20 three (3) votes were cast against the said proposal; that each of
21 said proposed directors received the following votes: E. L. Baird
22 thirty-two (32) votes; Albert W. Schneegas thirty-two (32) votes
23 and George B. Weiss thirty-two (32) votes;

24 3. That the Board of Supervisors of the County of Yolo
25 find and determine, and it does hereby find and determine, that
26 at such election, that is to say, the election held in the herein-
27 above described Yolo County Fire Protection District on the 28th
28 day of March, 1939, a majority of the votes cast ratify the
29 declaration of said Board of Supervisors made on the 21st day of
30 February, 1939, deciding to establish a county fire protection
31 district within the unincorporated territory in the County of
32 Yolo, State of California, hereinabove described, to be known as


1 Yolo County Fire Protection District in Yolo County; said Board of
2 Supervisors further hereby finds and determines that at said
3 election said E. L. Baird, Albert W. Schneegas and George B. Weiss
4 received the highest number of votes for directors of said
5 district;

6 4. That this resolution making the aforesaid findings
7 be entered upon the minutes of said Board of Supervisors of the
8 County of Yolo forthwith and that thereafter said Yolo County Fire
9 Protection District in Yolo County embracing the unincorporated
10 territory in the County of Yolo within the boundaries hereinabove
11 described shall be deemed to be established and organized, and
12 shall in fact be established and organized, as a county fire
13 protection district;


14 5. That said E. L. Baird, Albert W. Schneegas and
15 George B. Weiss be, and they are hereby, declared to be duly
16 elected to the offices of director of said Yolo County Fire
17 Protection District.

18 IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED and the Clerk of this
19 Board is hereby authorized and directed to cause a certified copy
20 of this resolution to be immediately filed for record in the office
21 of the County Recorder of the County of Yolo, the County within
22 which the land situated in said Yolo County Fire Protection Dis-
23 trict is wholly situated.
